Health Care Equity for People with Disabilities Marred by Barriers, Disparities, Discrimination

These include inaccessible facilities and exam and diagnostic equipment, lack of sign language interpreters, materials in accessible formats and other programmatic accommodations, limits on insurance coverage for assistive technology, and even outright discrimination.


