

Abortion Rights Are Disability Rights!

Abortion supports disabled people's autonomy. Access to all reproductive health care options empowers people to make decisions about their bodies and futures. People with disabilities have been and continue to be systematically denied this right because of forced sterilization, limits on marriage, restrictive conservatorships, and institutionalization. Ensuring access to abortion protects our freedom to make our own choices about our bodies, our futures, and our families.

Abortion is essential health care. Abortion can save a person's life when they experience medical complications during pregnancy. People with disabilities are just as likely to become pregnant as non-disabled people but are at higher risk of serious medical complications. Right now, disabled people are 11 times more likely to die during childbirth. Access to potentially life-saving emergency abortion care is essential for us.

Abortion is On the Ballot in Florida!

Proposition 4: Enshrine right to abortion in Florida state constitution. Protect abortion up to viability (usually ~24 weeks of pregnancy) and protect the life and health of the pregnant person. Prohibits government interference with the right. Still allows the legislature to require parental consent for minors.

Current abortion policy: Bans abortion after 6 weeks of pregnancy. Survivors of rape, incest or human trafficking can access abortion up to 15 weeks but must provide documentation of the abuse. Exceptions to save the pregnant person's life or if the fetus is not viable.
